

Service Disabled Veteran Owned Business Enterprises in State Contracting

It is the policy of the New York State Public Employment Relations Board and New York State to maximize opportunities for the participation of New York State business enterprises, including service disabled veteran owned business enterprises (“SDVOBs”) as contractors, subcontractors, and suppliers on its procurement contracts. Pursuant to Article 17-B, § 369, of the New York State Executive Law, before award of a contract, a potential contractor must submit to the State agency an Equal Employment Opportunity Policy Statement. All work conducted under the resulting contract with the agency must follow this policy. The successful contractor is required to make a good faith effort to solicit active participation by SDVOBs through normal purchasing of supplies, travel services, and/or equipment.
